New showcases for this year – *CH on the Homefront in WWII* and *Marvellous Medicine at the Infirmary*.

Current pupils have restored the old CH Model Railway Club trains – watch them in action!

Enjoy our exhibition *Brangwyn's Cartoons at Christ's Hospital*, all about the story of the murals in Chapel and the designer, craftsman who created them along with seven recently conserved sketches.

Where else can you see a manuscript signed by Samuel Pepys, an original poem by Samuel Taylor Coleridge, a badge designed by Sir Isaac Newton, find Captain Cook's Navigator and a piece of fuselage from Barnes Wallis' Wellington Bomber?

Reminisce about the CH Horsham and Hertford era through displays, scrapbooks, photos, *The Blue*, house lists and original film footage of St. Matthew's Day marching pupils from the 1920's & 30's.

Attempt to pass the 1899 entrance exam sitting at an original desk; try on our unique Tudor uniform, and visit our Museum Shop, selling unique CH souvenir memorabilia such as Housey magnets, new publications, postcards and CH novelties!
